## 8. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT – Kelvin L. Baker

Mr. Baker asked Ms. Paulette Murphy to address the Council in regard to the Community Festival that is taking place this upcoming weekend. Ms. Murphy informed the Council that the Community Festival will take on March 6<sup>th</sup>, on Hanford Boulevard between 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue, from 1:00 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. We currently have about 55 food, retail, and business vendors who will be at the event. The Council will have a booth, and there will be a Census booth and a donation booth for Haiti Relief. This Community Festival is also combined with the

Water Fest, which will be from 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. Also, the morning of the festival there will be the Teen Spring Clean-Up which begins at 8:00A.M. and concludes sometime around noon to 1:00 P.M. There will be three stages of entertainment and over 45 acts for children and adults, three DJs at the stages when there are no live performances, and a Kid Zone with rides. Radio Disney will be on-site from 3:00 P.M. until 5:00 P.M. Hot 105 and 99 Jamz will be broadcasting live from the festival and radio personality, Benji Brown, from 99 Jamz will also be there. Attendance is expected to be around 8,000 – 10,000 people.

Mr. Baker reported to the City Council on several infrastructure improvements currently underway. In the current budget there is close to \$11 million of capital improvement items and month-by-month they are gradually being completed. A roadway improvement project on NE 168 Street has been completed; that included drainage, curbing, sidewalk, on-street parking, and landscaping. The South Glade Driver Bike Path has been resurfaced. The parking lot in Mall South has been recently upgraded. Alleys next to the Fulford City Center have been resurfaced. Security infrastructure has been upgraded in City Hall. In the Carl Byoir Community, we have completed an entire resurfacing. Projects still in the works are the Highland Village sewer connections; 209 applicants have been approved. We are also working on the 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue Quarter project, which is a Federal Stimulus Project. Most of the sidewalk improvements have been completed, and the entire project should be completed around late April. We are hoping to have the digital message board coming on line around the same time.

**9. CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT – Darcee S. Siegel**

Ms. Siegel addressed the ruling in Aventura regarding red light cameras. A trial judge has issued a verbal order that the Red Light Camera program is unconstitutional. The attorneys representing the City of Aventura intend to appeal that decision. The City will not be stopping the Red Light Program, but will start escrowing funds if for some reason the lower court's ruling stands. Ms. Siegel also mentioned there has been a push in Tallahassee to pass legislation; and, as a result of these proceedings, this legislation is now on a fast track. The State is putting this issue at the forefront to ensure there is uniform legislation throughout the State of Florida benefiting everyone, including the drivers.

Mayor Rosner asked Ms. Siegel if the City Council needed to approve a resolution to urge the Legislature to address this issue in this session. Ms. Siegel responded that she would be happy to prepare a resolution to bring before the Council on March 16, 2010.

Ms. Siegel also reported that she has received five foreclosure proceedings in the past two weeks, it's slowed up a little bit but it hasn't stopped yet. Ms. Siegel said the City's water fees and liens on foreclosed properties are being paid by the banks. Code Enforcement has been in touch with the banks as soon as they purchase the property at auction. What normally happens is they will take over the property at whatever the outstanding mortgage amount was and they will try to flip it as-is. The City has been in contact with the property managers to make sure these homes are clean and taken care of, at least on the outside, so their neighbors do not have to put up with abandoned properties and live with nuisances.

## 10. MAYOR'S DISCUSSION

Mayor Rosner thanked the Army, specifically the Golden Knights, for giving Mayors the opportunity to support the troops. On Saturday, a lot of the Mayors were invited to parachute jump with the Golden Knights. Mayor Rosner stated he had participated and the experience had been amazing. Mayor Rosner said that at first he was turned down, but once he spoke to individuals in the organization and explained he would just need assistance, the Golden Knights allowed him to jump. As citizens of the United States, we should be proud of our Army. Mayor Rosner said the troops relayed stories of their progress in Iraq and Afghanistan, which is not always reported in the media. He commended and thanked the soldiers for defending our Country and giving us freedom here in the United States.

Mayor Rosner advised Police Chief Hernandez that he received a phone call this afternoon from a City resident who is currently renting in North Miami Beach, and their home has been broken into three times. They were so impressed by the way the officers handled the break-ins that they want to move into the City, or be annexed. The resident said the professionalism the officers displayed was absolutely incredible.

Mayor Rosner reminded everyone to fill out the Census on April 1<sup>st</sup>.

Councilwoman Spiegel asked, since school funding is at an all-time low, if the Mayors in Miami-Dade County could send a letter to each member of the Miami-Dade delegation, urging them not to leave Tallahassee until they address school funding and ensuring the students in Miami-Dade County can get as much money as possible. She asked if the Mayor could spearhead that on behalf of the City. Mayor Rosner said he would be delighted and hopes it will be successful. He stated that there is already a list of items that we are asking for and he suggested adding Councilwoman Spiegel's request to that list.

Vice Mayor Smith brought up the North Miami Senior High School's Robotic Club. They buy robot kits for \$5,000. They have always been sponsored, but this year their sponsor does not have the income. The Robotic Club has the robot; but, they need about \$20,000 to take the robot to compete in Orlando and Atlanta. Vice Mayor Smith suggested giving the Robotic Club a booth at the Community Festival so they can bring the robot and ask for donations.

Vice Mayor Smith also mentioned that there is approximately \$40,000 a year allotted in the budget per prisoner, but only \$3,600 allotted a year for each student. Vice Mayor Smith stated that she and the City Attorney are preparing a resolution to balance this the other way, and asked for the public's support.

**16. CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**VICE MAYOR SMITH**

**Condolences.** First, I'd like to take an extra minute. I did want to mention it because we've just lost one of our own employees, but we also have an employee that had his mother-in-law's funeral today too, unfortunately, and I would like to give our condolences from the City to the family of Gil Rosenkoff.

**Census.** When they talk about the Census, please don't forget that the difference if you don't record yourself -- if you don't record yourself, it's ten times different in money to our City. I'm talking about the fact that we are going to need roads, schools -- you hear that there's no money, there's no money, there's no money, but if we can get the 52,000-53,000 which it's -- they're here, the Manager and the Mayor would like 62,000-63,000, I will be very happy to have the number to be at least 53,000 so we can get that -- those funds come directly to our City. It's in dire need. Please, if they come to your door and ask for a social security number, they are not a Census person. There is no private information. It goes nowhere. You do not have to be a citizen. You don't have to be here legally. Just be sure you count everybody. Now, you cannot count your pets, but everybody else that's in that house, please be sure to fill out that Census. And, if you don't do it, they are going to come knocking. Don't be afraid. Just answer it, and send it back. That's the most important thing. The numbers are really significantly different.

**Black History Month Events.** I had the pleasure of attending quite a few of the Black History events that were put on. I can tell you, Paulette Murphy -- it doesn't do a good job -- her and her staff do the most remarkable job. You cannot go to anything in this City and not just enjoy it and be so glad that you were included and that you gave up your time to sit there. It was just unbelievable.

*Community Festival.* When you come to the Festival, we are all going to have different hours. If you want to speak to a Councilperson or you have a request for another Councilperson, just tell the person sitting there. That's a very important issue for me, I want us to be much more accessible to the public and we will be Saturday as we are enjoying all the festivities.

#### **COUNCILWOMAN SPIEGEL**

*County School Board Meeting.* I want to urge everybody to show up March 17, 2010 at the Dade County School Board, one last time to try and convince Dade County School Board not to make the proposed change with regard to the boundaries for Sunny Isles Beach. I want to thank Susie Smith publicly, once again, for yeoman's service. She has been incredible working on this with me and a driving force.

#### **COUNCILMAN JULIEN**

*Commendations.* If I can borrow some of what you said about Susie Smith. I had the privilege of attending a School Board function at Michael Krop High School, Wednesday of last week at 6:00 P.M. Obviously Susie was there and here is a young lady, who has no children, but she is a strong advocate for the youth of our community and she is very active in trying to better the children of our communities. And so for that, I applaud both Woody and Phyllis, because obviously they've done a good job and whatever it is that they have been able to instill in her. So, on behalf of all the children that need the support, I thank you for Susie's efforts.

I also would like to say that we have, as the City Manager stated, some phenomenal employees that really go under-appreciated in this City. They work very hard and if we were to take the number of hours that they work and divide it into the salary, as exorbitant as some people seem to think they are, if we were to take their hours and divide it into their salary, we would actually realize we are probably paying them just slightly below minimum wage. So, every now and again, I like to take the time and thank our employees and just give them the little pat on the back that they deserve because I see what they do. One classic example is one of our employees, Mr. Jean Pompee. Here's an individual and, for those of you who don't understand how Haitian media works, I'll just give you a very brief synopsis. The folks who are on the radio, they pay for the time themselves and Mr. Pompee has a show on every Saturday, one hour, but he has used his time without pay to allow the City of North Miami Beach to promote the Census. Why is he doing that? Because he obviously cares about this City that he works for and he wants to make sure that we surpass that 50,000 resident threshold. And so, on behalf of all the residents of the City of North Miami Beach, I thank Mr. Jean Pompee.

#### **COUNCILMAN DEROSE**

*Sympathies for Chile.* I want to seize this moment to express my heartfelt sympathy, my thoughts, and my prayers, to the citizens of the Republic of Chile. As we all know, last Sunday the country experienced a major earthquake and as a result more than 800 people lost their lives. I realize that we cannot fight with nature. All we can do is pray. I'm asking our citizens to pray for the Chilean people during this difficult time.

*Black History Month.* I want to wish everyone happy Black History month. I had the opportunity at attend many functions around Miami-Dade County, including one in Washington Park. It was very nice. I want to remember some of our heroes who really fought for equal justice. I want to

remember Dr. King, Malcolm X, Rosa Parks, and the way these people's legacies continue to influence a lot of people. I can say that many black elected officials we have today are because of these people's fight, people like Dr. King, Rosa Parks, who fought for equal justice: and, during Black History month, I want to remember all these people.

#### **COUNCILWOMAN KRAMER**

*Community Festival.* I look forward to seeing everybody come out on Saturday to the Community Festival, and I will be in the Council booth between 3:00 and 4:00 P.M. If you need to track me down, you'll know where to find me.

*Teen Spring Clean-Up.* I also want to remind the parents and students that all participants that we have for the 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Teen Spring Clean-Up, which is also Saturday, March 6<sup>th</sup>, it starts at 8:00 A.M until 2:00 P.M. and the participants get five community service hours towards your graduation. So, there's not much time left: graduation's around the corner. I suggest you come out and help North Miami Beach.

#### **COUNCILMAN PIERRE**

*Charter School.* With a delightful heart, I am pleased to report, as you can see tonight, the charter school in North Miami Beach is no longer a dream, but it's a reality.

*Welcome to Haitian Children.* I would like to welcome the new arrivees from Haiti. Last Friday I had a chance to escort 23 children as a result of the tragedy that occurred in Haiti. They are right here in the City. I don't know how many are already there, but personally as for the 23 last Friday, on behalf of the Mayor and Council, we wish you welcome in North Miami Beach.

*Community Festival.* March 6<sup>th</sup>, Community Festival, if you would please come out and enjoy yourself. That's maybe one chance you have in a lifetime to meet your Councilperson one-on-one. I'll be at the Council booth from 5:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M.; so, if you have a special issue for me, that's your time. You don't need an appointment, just show up.

*Census.* Census 2010 is upon us. This is very important. I cannot emphasize that enough. I had a chance to be at an event last week at one of the schools in North Miami Beach where we're educating the people about the importance of Census. I expected 50 to 75 people, but I was surprised. We had a full house. I want to say thank you to Mr. Greg Williams, to Mr. McGriff, to the City Manger, and to our City Employees for putting out pamphlets, water, you name it. For the first time, I had more people than materials. That's very encouraging. I'm looking forward to having more events of that nature at other schools in the City.
