

Land-use and zoning regulations approved

The City of North Miami Beach has recently adopted new land-use and zoning regulations promoting mixed-use development, with greater density, building height and development flexibility for several key potential development areas. Approved on March 17th, the new rules include requirements for publicly accessible open space, pedestrian paths and bicycle facilities, and other public amenities. The target areas include the area around the former TECO gas plant, West Dixie Highway, Intracoastal Mall in Eastern Shores, the City's "Downtown" area along Hanford Boulevard and 19th Avenue, and the area around 163rd Street and Biscayne Boulevard, including around the location of a future transit station on the FEC rail line.

As a City government, one of our organization's missions is to provide excellent municipal services in a financially and environmentally responsible

manner. The City's "Vision 2029" of its adopted Strategic Plan contains the principles of Convenient Mobility and Vibrant "Downtown" with a desire for unique public transportation with attractive stations serving the community, walkable neighborhoods, a vibrant downtown, and the availability of many types of alternative transportation modes. The Mayor and City Council initiated the mixed-use zoning concept over a year ago, in fulfillment of these strategic goals. City planning staff together with consultants from Redevelopment Management Associates (RMA) spearheaded the initiative through over a dozen public workshops, hearings and meetings with stakeholders. The unanimous approval of the amendments by the Mayor and Council on March 17th is a sign that these changes will help lead to a new renaissance for NMB.

New Police Officers & Vehicles

The North Miami Beach Police Department has new wheels! During FY 2013-14, the Department was able to save enough money from the general fund budget to purchase 16 new vehicles. The first set of vehicles; 2015 Ford Utility patrol vehicles arrived at the Police Department on Monday, March 23, 2015. These vehicles are the first police vehicles to be purchased with general fund monies since 2009. The aging fleet was falling into disrepair; with those vehicles reach-

ing well in excess of 100,000 miles and with models up to 15 years old.

The all-wheel drive utilities will better prepare the Department to respond during severe conditions. In addition to these vehicles, nine more vehicles will refresh the Detective Bureau and Administrative staffing fleet.

An additional sixteen vehicles have been ordered from Ford Motor Company utilizing Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) monies. These vehicles are scheduled delivery in June.



Our City's Strategic Plan adopted by an unanimous vote from our Mayor and Council, had a number one priority for a safer NMB; we are delivering for our City.

<Since September of 2013, the North Miami Beach Police Department has added fourteen new police officers. NMB Police Department Re-Launches "Officer Friendly Program"

Chief J. Scott Dennis kicks off a pilot program, becoming a city initiative, beginning this month at Greynold's Park Elementary School. The Officer Friendly Program is a model program to acquaint children with law enforcement officers as part of a community relation component.

Chief Dennis had the opportunity to meet many of our young people during the NMB Winterfest; one little girl was very much afraid of the police officers in uniform. When the Chief asked the little girl why she was afraid, she said she was just scared of the police. A positive rapport with all of our residents is the goal of the Department. This interaction with a six-year-old child inspired the Chief to start the Officer Friendly Program here in North Miami Beach. The Officer Friendly

Program is designed to humanize young children's perception of police officers, improve the rapport between children and police, increase awareness, and reduce crimes involving children. Topics include a range of safety and crime prevention tips from "Stranger Danger" to "What to do in an Emergency."

The three week program will explain officers' responsibilities; enhance relations and understanding between the police officers and the youth of our City. It will build relationships as well as bring awareness to the students that police officers are their friends and are real people with families. The three week program will conclude with a Safety Day Ceremony, congratulating the students for taking a pledge of friendship and a picture with their Officer Friendly.

Chief Dennis will also implement the

"Chief for the Day Essay Contest" involving the Safety Patrol Officers and the Youth Crime Watch Members, 4th or 5th graders, from several of the North Miami Beach Elementary Schools. The contest will consist of identifying a problem or concern the student would like to change in their community or neighborhood where the Police Department will put their ideas to work! The winners of this program will be invited to the Police Department and will wear an authentic police uniform for that day, receive a plaque, and other police memorabilia. The day will consist of breakfast with the Chief and his staff, official swearing in and an action packed day with members of the Police Department.

HIGHLAND VILLAGE COMMUNITY CENTER


Upgrades to this facility at 13651 NE 21st Avenue will include interior renovations and resurfacing of the basketball courts.
