We are pleased to announce NMB Water has won the FWEA 2016 *Collection System of the Year Award* for a medium size systems category.

The Wastewater division includes 33 pump stations, 112 miles of sanitary sewer line and over 1,800 manholes in the waste water system. In addition to the traditional sanitary wastewater collection systems of gravity lines serving a master pumping station, North Miami Beach has incorporated a low pressure sanitary wastewater system consisting of 68 grinder pump stations and approximately five miles of low-pressure force mains. We serve over 7,300 wastewater customers both inside and outside our city limits, serving a population of approximately 25,000. The City's wastewater collection system is interconnected with Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Administration (MDWASA).

NMB Water earned the *Collection System of the Year award* for a medium size system through their efforts in the areas of Safety, Best Management Practices, introduction of new sewer lines, mitigation of sanitary sewer overflows and the recent completion of a major inflow and infiltration rehabilitation project.
