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Pedro Herrera from Sugarman and Susskind discussed the law suit against Merrill Lynch. Pedro Herrera is asking the board for authorization to file a claim on behalf of the City of North Miami Beach Police & Fire and General Plans against Merrill Lynch. This is based on the SEC finding that Merrill Lynch was doing things such as excessive generation of fees through transition of accounts and trading, providing generic asset allocation models rather than specific models for their clients and undisclosed fees.

Sugarman and Susskind will join Robert Klausner's firm with the lawsuit against Merrill Lynch.

There will be no legal fees for going forward with this lawsuit, since Sugarman and Susskind will be on a contingent basis fee. This lawsuit could take 2 – 3 years before it will be resolved.


